Here was an ordinary looking man, riding on a donkey in a home-made robe, with no weapon but His gentle words... a man who would be executed like a common criminal before the week was out.

But to proclaim Jesus as Lord in the 21st century is just as difficult. To proclaim as Lord someone who has been gone for so many years... to proclaim as Lord someone who rarely demonstrates His power openly in our world today is a difficult thing to do. It can only be done by faith.

I hope you can join us for worship on Easter Sunday when we share the "Easter Surprise"! 6:30 or 9:30... it doesn't matter. It will be an Easter you won't soon forget! The victory is ours! Christ is risen! He has risen indeed! Halleluia!

God blesses us all in many different ways and often from many different sources. That is the case for all of us who are First Lutheran Church. This past month we received two tremendous gifts allowing us to grow the vibrancy of our worship services by restoring and maintaining our treasured organ.

The first gift came from the Fred Maytag Family Foundation which gave nearly \$39,000 for the completion of Phase II of the organ restoration. The organ itself was a gift from Fred Maytag in 1938, and their generous action will bring this magnificent instrument back to life.

The second gift of just over \$10,000 came from Matt and Diane Egenes. Matt, the son of Paul and Lois Egenes, now lives with his family in Dallas, Texas. Both Lois and Paul recently passed away. Lois was our devoted Church organist for many years. Paul was probably responsible for getting many of us at First Lutheran to join in the first place. This gift will go into an organ maintenance fund, and some of the funds will also be used to pay for organists this year to play for worship services periodically.

In response to this generous gift from the Egenes family, First Lutheran Church will be donating \$500 per semester, in Paul and Lois' name, to the Grinnell College Music program for those majoring in church performance. Paul was a graduate of Grinnell College and their daughter Marie took violin lessons there.

News from Zinga!

Work goes on at Zinga, even as Paula and Denny continue to spread the word here. They are currently in Idaho, and will be heading back to Overland Park via Washington and Colorado. Denny just turned 90 on February 20. On April 12, they return to Tanzania.

At the Children's Hospital, Zinga, the Mary Ellen Kitundu Memorial Birthing Center should be completed by the end of February. Work on the operating theatre and NICU building is also proceeding nicely. This will have to be completed before the hospital can admit women for childbirth.


Another need is an ambulance. Mary Ellen's son Peter Kitundu of Des Moines has offered a Valentine's Day—Have-a-Heart \$4000 challenge grant to move closer to this goal. The challenge ends on April 1, so if a gift in support of the Children's Hospital is part of your Lenten journey, this would be a good place to put it. Sometimes patients come in too sick, or in need of surgery, and have to be referred to larger hospitals. The only taxi service in Zinga is a small motorcycle, so the need for an ambulance is clear.

Judy Monroe is spearheading our project to create feminine hygiene kits for the hospital. Look for more information on this soon. A container will be loaded in Missouri the first week of April, so this is definitely a win—win situation.
