Thank You for Your Generosity to the Community Meal

The April Choices in Mission project was the Community Meal. First Lutheran normally serves a meal on the fourth Wednesday of the month and during the school year those meals are served at the First United Methodist Church located southwest across the street from us. We also help if there is a fifth Wednesday in the month.

The meals are funded by donations. We have a Community Meal fund here at First Lutheran and in the past the Salvation Army was a partner in sponsoring the meals. During this past year that partnering sponsorship ended as the Salvation Army took stock of what they felt they could be involved in. Also in the past, Sacred Heart Catholic Church became the meal site during the summer months and this year could not take on that position due to scheduling conflicts. That left the Community Meal with an uncertain future this spring. We only knew we had funds and a place through the end of May.

Dirk and Marlys Amundsen, who lead First Lutheran's involvement in the project, feel strongly about it's benefits to our community. Meals are regularly served to 80-100 people a night. Working with council approval, they planned the summer meals to happen every two weeks, on Wednesday nights, here at First Lutheran. As the April Choices in Mission, donations of \$870 were received for the Community Meal and were matched in full to a total of \$1740.

Thanks to your generosity, our meals are funded for the rest of this year, and should last for a full calendar year with our normal frugal management. We are so grateful! This includes our thanks for all the time and food you donate, as it's too much for one to have the time for all the desserts and each batch of garden produce you donate. It is very true that many hands make light work. If you have the time to help at a meal this summer, give it a try and come hear the thanks from all the people that are so thankful to have that meal available to them.

Just a few weeks ago the decision was made that First Lutheran would host a community meal every other Wednesday during the summer. This was being done because the church that had provided these meals decided not to this year. Marlys of course was heading up this effort and had already set the dates and menus.

Now you and I have an opportunity. We can give of our time to see this plan through and impact the lives of those people in Newton who are less fortunate than us. We need people who can shop for ingredients, prepare and cook, and finally serve. We only have to do one meal at a time, and we can do it.

There are many other ways to be involved in the ministry of First Lutheran, from helping with Bible School, to tending flower beds, serving coffee on Sunday, or serving on Council. The point is the Church is not a building, it is you and me doing God's work here in this place and around the world. There are many of us who are busy, but what is important to us gets done. Our lives are a series of choices and we need to remember that Jesus should be one of our highest priorities. Stewardship of our time can be one of the greatest challenges that we face, and it can also be one of the greatest sources of fulfillment.

On the Road to Success

As everyone was preparing for the Christmas season last year, Ali was eager to finally give his family a gift he'd been dreaming of: a second car.

After Ali came to the U.S. as a refugee from Somalia in 2014, he dedicated his time to finding a job and building a better life for his family. But he and his wife struggled to keep up with both of their busy jobs and caring for their four children with one vehicle.

"It was a very stressful time for my family, especially when emergencies happened or schedules changed," Ali says.

Ali decided to make it his goal to set aside money for a second car. He used LSI's Refugee Community Services Individual Development Accounts (IDA) program to save the money he needed.

Through the program, Ali has received guidance through basic financial literacy classes and one-on-one coaching to prepare him for the new car-buying experience.

Now, Ali and his family are thriving. They have reliable transportation, and Ali feels confident knowing his family's needs will be met every day.

"I'm very thankful for LSI and this opportunity," Ali says. "It is really good of them to offer this program, and it has made a great impact for my family."
