JUSTFAITH

Newton, Iowa has been chosen to host the new JustFaith program in Jasper County. The vision of JustFaith Ministries is that the work of peace, mercy, and justice is best done by groups of people working together. Communities can accomplish things that individuals simply cannot."

JustFaith is designed for people who want to live more simply, love more compassionately, and make a difference by responding to the needs of the world. This small group program will help you explore today's issues through the lens of your faith and formulate a personal/group response. Through prayer, engaging reading, thought-provoking dialogue and relationship building, you'll share a journey of faith that invites you to consider how you can "be the change" in our world. The JustFaith program explores today's issues through the lens of the Christian faith, but is open to anyone who would like to participate including those who are not aligned with any faith community.


JustFaith is made up of three, eight-week phases that can be taken individually or together. The three phases of JustFaith are:

- Phase 1, Living Compassionately: Caring for the Poor, this focuses on poverty, consumerism, and the Gospel call to care for those in need. (October 10)
- Phase 2, Living Justly: Caring for Each Other, develops a deeper understanding about issues of racial and economic justice.
- Phase 3, Living Simply: Caring for the Earth, encourages participants to embrace the invitation to care for the earth while learning more about the intersection between poverty and environmental stewardship.

The program will begin October 10 and will be held on Wednesday evenings from 6:00-8:00pm at Stephen's Episcopal Church in Newton Iowa. August LSI Update

Back to School Month

School is right around the corner! But imagine being a child or teen with an emotional or behavioral disorder. This time of year can be extremely stressful. They are afraid they won't be able to concentrate or fit in at their school. They worry about adjusting to a new classroom routine or making new friends.

Did you know Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) partners with schools across the state to provide mental health services? Our therapists work one-on-one with children while our Behavioral Health Intervention Services team collaborates with families in their own homes to help them develop skills like anger management and healthy decision-making. LSI also provides 24-hour mental health care at the Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers in Waverly and Ames to empower lowa's most vulnerable children and teens.

A Loving Bond for Landon

Seven years ago, Ashley was eager to welcome her first child, Landon. While Landon was a perfectly behaved newborn, Ashley began feeling overwhelmed when his behavior changed as he grew.

Landon stopped napping. He began throwing tantrums and lashed out when Ashley tried to help him. Ashley was desperate for a relationship with her toddler, but Landon always pushed her away. She turned to LSI's Behavioral Health Intervention Services.

Peggy, Landon's LSI worker, began visiting their home to help Landon develop the coping skills he needed to control his anger and guide him back to being the happy child he once was. Peggy and Landon began taking walks together, visiting the library, and playing games. When the family moved to a new home, Peggy made sure Landon was comfortable in his room and encouraged him to use it as a safe space when he needed to be alone.

Peggy and Landon have been working together for years and Landon, now 7, knows he has a support system to turn to on the rough days.

"We would truly be lost without Peggy," Ashley says. "Now Landon gives hugs, lets me know when he's angry and – the biggest gift of all – I occasionally hear, 'I love you, Mom'."
