Hand sanitizing stations will still be available; and we encourage their use. Holy Communion will be contactless, but some changes will be made as we move back to regular cups and wafers. We discourage the use of

will NOT be provided. Everything you need to know will be projected on the screens.

We ask that you use your best judgment about attending worship in person. I hope that if you choose to stay home, you will watch us live, or at a time that is convenient for your schedule. We will continue to livestream worship on Sunday mornings and it will be available on Facebook as soon as Dossible after the service. Please be patient with us as we work out all the technical issues involved in getting the service to you. It is not an easy task!

Zinga News!

In a recent update from Zinga, Selemani "Sele" Shabani talks about the ongoing work of maintenance, and on the maintenance workers being trained by the Bagamoyo fire department in starting to put out fires in the half hour it will take for the fire trucks to get there. Last year, what started as a grass fire burned down two of the small round guest houses where volunteers stay. Of course, there were no guests in the midst of the Covid pandemic, so no one was hurt, but this training adds another layer of protection.

Dr. Bonaventura "Bon" Mezezele also shares a couple of stories, one about a two-year-old who is being treated for sickle cell anemia. Because the toddler's case was unusual, Dr. Bon consulted with doctors at the Blood Center in Minneapolis, and the child is receiving special treatment and being closely followed.

The other story is about a woman who came back to the hospital just to say "Thank you." After struggling to conceive, consulting with doctors at more than one hospital, she came to the Children's Hospital several months ago. Prenatal vitamins was all her body needed, and she became pregnant with twins! She stopped by with her beautiful babies.

All of this is possible because we and others share of our blessings and keep the hospital and those who work there in our prayers.

Paula and Denny are still in Overland Park, eagerly waiting for the time when it will be safe for them to resume travels to share the story of IHP and the Children's Hospital, the nursing school at Dodoma, and the bright young Tanzanians whose medical education IHP is sponsoring.

Finding Paradise

Perseverance is a familiar quality for Mon, who after spending decades living as a refugee from an early age was recently able to place roots in lowa and succeed in building a life for his family.

After living in a Nepali refugee camp for almost 24 years, Mon's family was able to resettle in the U.S. When they arrived in Iowa, they moved directly into a tiny apartment. But the single room was not sufficient for their family – especially once their youngest daughter was born. They stayed in the apartment for four years, but Mon was determined to create a better home for his family.

Mon secured housing for his family through the Habitat for Humanity program, and through LSI Refugee and Immigrant Services, he was able to get on track and save and earn money towards his goal of homeownership. With guidance from staff in LSI's Match and Save financial program, he was able to open a savings account and develop a monthly savings plan.

Mon and his family moved into their new home last year, and he said LSI and Habitat for Humanitv were critical steps in helping him learn about U.S. finances and savings – lessons that will pay off during his journey as a homeowner. *"I felt very sad when I left my* country," Mon says. "I felt as if I lost my paradise. But when I got the key and when I entered my house, I felt that I regained my lost paradise. So that was the happiest moment in my life and right now, I, my family, and kids are super happy to live in this new house."

Church Council Meeting Review :

The church council met on May 20 at 6:30 p.m. in the fellowship hall. Jane led devotions. The minutes were read and approved and Corinne presented the treasurer's report.

In new business: Jane moved and Kay seconded the following plan for church services starting in June: Masking/social distancing will continue, as will collection of offering and communion as has been done now. One small adjustment to communion will happen when the pre filled cups have all been used. Pastor Mark will announce that. We will be going back to the full service with music being sung by the congregation, excepting hymns during communion that will not be sung, but music will be played. All service information will be on the screens, no hymnals used yet at this time. The council will discuss possible fellowship in June. Motion

passed.

Council on duty plan was revised to include live streaming the services. Jane will type the plan. The ushers will continue to light the candles until fall when this can be considered again for youth as there would

be several the correct age. The offering counters' plan is being adjusted to include those who need to count on Sundays after services. Those folks will count, place the offerings and deposit slip in a regular bank bag and it will be dropped in the night deposit at the bank. The church secretary will then drive by the bank the following week to retrieve the bag and deposit slip. If counting on Monday, the original plan will be followed.

Our church needs to decide if we will continue with the monthly community meals (held at the Methodist church) by July. Tabled the discussion until June when a possible plan

will be discussed. In old business: Nicole will continue to mail service packets to members who can't attend church and/or do not have the internet. Jim will help her revise that list.

Nicole will put a request in the email/newsletter asking members to adopt the front/west landscape beds for a month starting in July to keep them weeded and looking tended. April, May, and June have already been adopted.

Pastor Mark reported that he will be doing 'in house' services for the UCCC church next door starting May 30. Those will follow our service time. He has also started in person visits again. Judy Monroe and Allison Bartholmey will attend the remote Synod Assembly along with Pas-

tor Mark starting May 21. Faith Formations report included recognition on the outdoor sign for our two graduates. VBS will be held in collaboration with United Presbyterian church the week of June 14 in the mornings. Allison Bartholmey will be heading the team with Robin Friedman from our church and a team

from UP assisting.


The next meeting will be held on June 17.
