Zinga News!

Even though Covid has made it impossible to safely travel to Zinga, Paula Lofstrom stays in touch by daily phone calls. In the November Update, Paula said: "We pray for rain at Zinga as there is a terrible drought there now and rain may not come until April. Cattle are dying. Children are starving." This situation has not changed, so

please pray for rain in Tanzania!

Meanwhile, children continue to be seen at the Children's Hospital. Recently, a tiny premature baby was brought in. Baby Amina is one month old and was born at 36 weeks gestation. Most likely, her mother had an intrauterine infection. The baby had a fever, microcephaly (a small head), and poor reflexes. Dr. Jesse Kitundu diagnosed sepsis of prematurity and put her on a 10-day regimen of broadspectrum antibiotics. At five days, the baby was noticeably better.

If the mother had been seen earlier in her pregnancy and had been given prenatal vitamins and an antibiotic, the baby would have been carried full-term. That is why the Maternal and Child Health Center (MHC) will be so beneficial to the mothers and children of Zinga.

And speaking of the MHC, raising the money to complete construction of this facility was our Choices in Mission focus in October. Not only did the church match our contributions dollar for dollar up to \$5,000 for a total gift of \$13,385, we also participated in the \$25,000 matching funds challenge active at the time. The funds raised to unlock those \$25,000 exceeded \$36,000, so the total raised was in excess of \$61,000. Soon, the MCH will be a reality, and we will have been a part of that. Thank you!

We are all aware of the tragic consequences of wind storms, and now Kentucky and other states are reeling following tornados. The Service Committee has decided to start a Choices in Mission for Lutheran Disaster Relief. This will give you the opportunity to respond knowing that your gift will be doubled. envelopes in the pews just check the box that says Monthly Mission, or you can mail or drop it off in the church office.

Church Council Meeting Review:

The church council met on December 16 at 6:30. All council members and Pastor Mark were in attendance as well as Allison Bartholmey. Bryan provided devotions, and the minutes were reviewed and approved. Aaron Barthomey and Mark Monroe gave a report from the call committee. They have met twice with the committee from CUCC and worked out the details in the packets provided from the Synod and the CUCC organization. The committee is seeking guidance from the council on the pay package our church can provide. Corinne will assist them with that part of the task. Council agreed that our church would take care of the financial part of the new minister and CUCC would reimburse us for their part of that package. The call committees will reduce the number of people working to finalize the profile after the first of the year. Pastor's report included visits

with two families dealing with illnesses. He has also been in contact with the Synod about a possible gap between his retirement and a new minister. We will not have another Interim, instead will be served with pulpit supply ministers. They will send a list of folks to call. It should not be too many weeks.

Council approved action to purchase a new check printer. Corinne will take care of that in the new year. Council approved up to \$2500 match for the ELCA Disaster Relief project from Mission Support Funds. The council voted to keep Pastor's insurance reimbursement at \$600/month per his request. The bylaws are being revised. Council looked at the revisions and will make final decisions in January. They will then be sent to the congregation and final approval per congregational vote will be done at the meeting on January 30th.

The treasurer's report was presented and reviewed.
Committee reports were made. Property reported that all painting from storm damage is complete and the bill for painting will be paid. Service committee has shifted projects to accommodate the ELCA project for Dec/Jan. Fellowship continues to hold coffee hour (none planned for Dec. 26 unless someone wants to make coffee) and have a prayer chain/visiting angel group. Meeting adjourned.
