## Zinga News Update!

Great news from Zinga! After frustrating Covid-caused absence, Dr. Denny and Paula Lofstrom are starting to plan their return to Zinga in March. About five medical students and an intern from different Mayo Medical schools are asking to serve their rotations there. The hope is that by then, it will be safe to travel, and teams of volunteers will be able to come.

Meanwhile, at the Children's Hospital, work continues. A four-month old baby girl was recently referred to the hospital for treatment.

After a week of treatment, the baby was eating well, and the fever was gone. The only complication was that her skin was still peeling.

Dr, Charles Powell explains the peeling skin:

"This is scalded skin syndrome, caused usually by Staph aureus infection. It happens that this was hospital acquired, during a 10-day hospitalization at another facility.

School is right around the corner! This time of year can be exciting and stressful for many of us, but adjusting back into a classroom routine can be especially difficult for kids and teens with emotional or behavioral disorders.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) provides mental and behavioral health services for children and families across the state. Our therapists provide virtual and in-person therapy sessions with children, while our Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS) team collaborates with families in their home to help them develop skills like anger management and healthy decision making. LSI also provides 24-hour mental health care at our Bremwood Residential Treatment Center in Waverly to empower Iowa children and teens.

## Support for the Long Run

Part of LSI's mission is to ensure hundreds of lowa children and families have access to quality mental health care, parenting education, and crisis services.

On our Bremwood Residential Treatment Center campus in Waverly, staff are able to provide 24/7 behavioral health care and encouragement for children and teens like N. During her time on campus, N. and her team of therapists and professionals worked on developing coping skills that could help her manage her anger on the difficult days and take space for herself when she felt overwhelmed.

She was able to participate in Spiritual Life, a voluntary faith-based program offered on campus. N. says the program helped her learn important lessons about forgiveness and trust through reading passages of scripture. She says the biggest lesson she has learned is that "when you make a mistake, there are ways to fix it."

N. is now looking ahead and has goals for her future. She is working on graduating high school, and she is excited to get her driver's license. She wants to become a special education teacher and empower the next generation, and she wants her story to inspire other kids who could benefit from the same care she received through LSI.

## The power of love

Supremely, Jesus gives to all the meal of Holy Communion, the bread and wine that are his very body and blood.





# A living mystery

In Walking on Water, Madeleine L'Engle guotes Emmanuel Suhard, a French cardinal in the Catholic Church during the 1940s: "To be a witness does not consist in engaging in propaganda, nor even in stirring people up, but in being a living mystery. It means to live in such a way that one's life would not make sense if God did not exist." What would it look like in your life to be "a living mystery" — to live in a way that wouldn't make sense if not for God's existence? What risks might you take for the sake of wholeness and justice in the world? To what lengths might you go to serve a neighbor? What fears might no longer fill your heart and rule your mind? Will you see Jesus in people who are poor, be surprised to find him revealed amid suffering? What "fruits" might you allow the Holy Spirit to cultivate in you - generosity, patience, selfcontrol? What grace will you show to others because you have experienced God's love so powerfully? All of which makes sense only because God exists!
